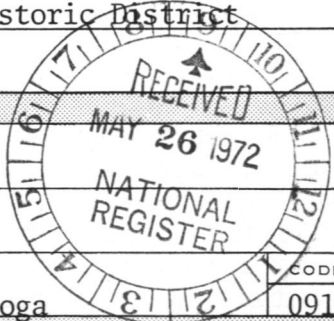

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This district in Saratoga Springs forms roughly a triangle including the Canfield Casino, Congress Park surrounding it, and ten Nineteenth Century buildings on Circular Street on the southeastern rim of the park. The district is bounded on the west by Broadway, on the north by Spring Street and along the southeast by the rear property lines of #20, #30, #34, #38, #42, #46, #62, #82, #88 Circular Street.

The thirty-three acres forming Congress Park today, are an accumulation of property acquired by the city in the early 1900's. They consist of the old Congress Spring holdings including the site of the bottling works and Congress Spring Park; the Canfield Casino and its park; and the Congress Hotel property. Scattered through the essentially basin-shaped park are paths, groves of trees, lawns, Italian gardens and springs with Grecian pavilions. The abundant water supply has been channelled into streams, ponds, and fountains. The most notable fountain surrounds Daniel Chester French's statue, "Spirit of Life" and is a memorial to Saratoga's benefactor, Spencer Trask. Two vases designed by the Danish sculptor Albert Bertel Thorvaldsen depicting "Day" and "Night" stand on the lawn in front of the Casino.

The Casino is situated in the hollow of the park facing south. It was built in two stages: the main building and east wing in 1867 to 1869, and the dining room and kitchen extension to the north in 1902-3. The building has a soft pink to orange hue characteristic of the brick of the Upper Hudson River kilns.

The main portion of the building is rectangular in layout. It is three stories with a basement. The structure is wood framed to center bearing walls. On the front (south) facade the brick around the front doorway and at the corners of the first floor and east wing is made to look like rusticated stone. A belt course delineates the first and second floors. The front (south) facade is distinguished by a different treatment of the sandstone window trim--segmental pediments over the windows and front door on the first floor, triangular pediments on the second, and rectangular ones on the third. The roofline is accentuated by a richly ornamented cornice with brackets. This cornice continues along the west side of the building. Centered above the cornice on the front (south) facade is a free-standing segmental pediment.

On the interior is a central hall with the stairway. On the first floor office and library were located on the west side and on the east a room that was the first dining room opens into the large gambling room in the east wing. On the second floor were three private gambling rooms and on the third, living quarters.

The east wing where the large gaming room is located is three bays wide on the front (south) facade and the east facade is five bays wide. In contrast to the main portion of the building, the doorway and the two windows flanking it are one and a half stories high. Over the arched window heads are segmental pediments and over the doorway a triangular pediment echoing the alternate treatment of pediments on the front facade of the

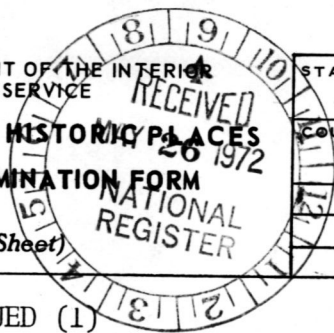

three-story portion. The cornice, too, reflects that of the main buildings but is more ornate. There are two domes in the roof of the gaming room. Interior details of the room--woodwork, ceiling, immense mirrors, statuettes, lighting fixtures and some furniture--still remain.

The dining room and kitchen wing to the rear (north) date from 1903. This addition required the removal of several one story service wings that used to stand behind the building. The dining room is a brick structure with floor framing supported on steel beams. The arched roof is framed with riveted arch beams supported on columns. The kitchen and rear storage area are brick with floor framing supported by steel beams and the roof by an inverted truss.¹

The huge dining room, measuring 93' x 58' runs on an east-west axis. At either end are stained glass windows depicting horses in different historical periods. The barrel vaulted ceiling has octagonal coffers which were once opened by stained glass windows. The room is richly decorated with plaster-work and had for its time had an innovative system of indirect lighting.

Overlooking the park on the southeast are the following Circular Street buildings included in the district.

#20 Circular Street commonly known as the "Batcheller House" is a distinctive three story residence on a V-shaped plot designed by Albany architects Nichols and Halcott and copyrighted in 1873. Its fanciful roofline is a combination of steep gables and finials, and a tower capped with a minaret. The exterior is of vertical boarding. There are numerous balconies, porches, and balustrades. The house was built for George Sherman Batcheller, the U. S. Representative to the International Tribunal in Egypt in the 1870's.

#24 Circular Street also called "The Lawns" and "Nolan House" is presently the Convent of Sisters of St. Joseph. This yellow brick three story house with a mansard roof was designed by Stevens and Vaughn known in Saratoga for their United States Hotel which has since been demolished.

#30 Circular Street commonly known as "Foley House" is a two and a half story white stucco residence with gables and brick carriage house at rear. It is presently used as a Skidmore College dormitory and dates from the 1860's.

#34 Circular Street or "Thomas House" is a two and a half story yellow clapboard residence with a tower. The building which was built in the 1870's has a gable roof, an enclosed front porch and bay windows. It is used as the Saratoga County Mental Health Clinic.

#38 Circular Street or Hubbell House" is a delicately detailed two story white clapboard villa with a centered cupola and front porch. It was built in the late 1860's and is used for faculty housing for Skidmore College.

#42 Circular Street or "Dominican Convent" is a three and a half story white clapboard residence with an assymmetrically placed tower and a front porch. It was built in the 1870's and is presently used for faculty housing.

#46 Circular Street, "President's House" is a white clapboard Greek Revival two-story residence built about 1823. This fine building is long associated with Congress Park as it was originally built for Dr. John Clarke who began the bottling of Congress Spring Water, donated the Thorraldsen Vases in front of the Casino, and also designed and named Circular Street. The house is now the residence of Skidmore College's President.

#62 Circular Street is a three story brick building with a gable roof and front porch. It was built in the early 1870's originally as a residence and later became Brown's Boarding House. Skidmore added a classroom wing around 1930 and the building is presently known as the "Griffith House."

#82 Circular Street formerly "Temple Grove Seminary" presently "Skidmore Hall" is a four story brick structure with a front gable. It was originally built around 1856 and was used as a young ladies seminary in the winter and a hotel in the summer. The five story addition dates from the 1890's.

#88 Circular Street or "Circular Street House" is a three story brick residence with a mansard roof located on the northeast corner of Spring and Circular Street. It is an important visual anchor for the district. It was built in the 1870's for Dr. Sylvester Strong who maintained a sanitarium next door for the cure of many diseases with mineral water.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Saratoga Spring's international fame as a health spa and gambling center stems from two important sites: the Congress Spring and the Casino. The Casino-Congress Park-Circular Street Historic District incorporates these two sites in their natural and architecturally appropriate setting.

Congress Spring was so named when it was discovered in the late ^{18th} 19th century by a group of adventurers including a member of the first congress. The spring was rediscovered in 1802 by Gideon Putnam, but in 1817 it was described as still just "an uncultivated piece of ground at the foot of a beautiful little cascade." By the turn of the 20th century, the area was transformed. The grounds of Congress Spring Park were internationally renown with grecian pavilions over the springs, fountains, pools, flower beds, gravelled walks, a bandstand and a deer lodge. Prominent landscape architects including Frederick Law Olmsted and Jacob Weidenman in 1875 and Charles Leavitt and Henry Bacon in 1914 contributed to the development of the park. /

The northwest corner of the present day park is the former site of three buildings demolished in the second decade of the 20th century--Congress Hall, the Congress Spring Bottling plant and the Congress Spring Pavilion. Congress Hall was a hotel first built in 1802 by the foresighted Gideon Putnam and at that time known as "Putnam's Folly." Later it was rebuilt to monumental proportions in 1866. The bottling plant and pavilion were outgrowths of Dr. John Clarke's development of the spring which he bought in 1826 when it was little more than a quagmire. By 1878 a million bottles were sold each year, and the fame of Congress Spring water was world-wide. Both Congress Hall and the bottling plant were razed by the city which acquired the properties during the first World War, and today the public library and the Trask Memorial fountain stand on their sites. Though the Casino's history has been frequently studied and written about, the original architect and the exact sequence of its early construction is not known. The building has been associated with two exceptional personalities--John Morrissey and Richard Canfield. Morrissey, an Irishman from Troy whose career as a heavy-weight fighter peaked in the 1850's, chose to retire in Saratoga Springs as a gentleman gambling house proprietor. He built the Casino in 1866 and established its reputation. Richard Canfield, a gambling house operator from New York City, took over the Casino as a partner in 1893, and in the following year he took complete possession.

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SECTION 8 SIGNIFICANCE CONTINUED (1)

Canfield had grandiose schemes and a successful flair. The monumental dining hall designed by Clarence Luce and the kitchen extension were built in 1903, and some of the biggest games in gambling history were played under the roof of Canfield's Casino. The Casino deserves a chapter in the nation's social history. Here mingled, dined, and gambled the paradoxical and yet eminently compatible combination of members of the socially prominent families, such as Whitneys, Vanderbilts, Morgans; flamboyant gambling personalities, such as Bet-a-million Gates and Diamond Jim Brady; and prominent figures of the entertaining world, such as Lillian Russell, Florenz ~~Siegfeld~~.

In 1911, the city bought the Casino and at the present time the first two floors are being restored by the Saratoga Historical Society and the third floor is a museum devoted to Chancellor Walworth, the last Chancellor of New York.

Circular Street was designed and named by Dr. John Clarke, who built his house there (#46) in the 1820's. The original plan for the street was a complete semi-circle, but it ended up with just a quarter turn. The buildings along Circular Street which date from the 1870's relate to the park both visually and historically. The exuberant and expansiveness of Saratoga Springs in its heyday show through today in the lively variety of architectural treatments of the Circular Street houses.
