DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The twin towers of the administration building of the Buffalo State Hospital dominates the northwest section of the Buffalo skyline. The administration building is at the apex of the complex with a flattened "V" shaped plan. When designed by H.H. Richardson in 1870-1872 five connected wards radiated from the east and west sides of the central unit of this outstanding example of late nineteenth institutional architecture. Unfortunately the three eastern most wards were torn down in the 1960's. This reduced the original overall length of 2,200 feet. Today twelve buildings of the Richardson complex survive including the administration building, five wards on the west, two wards on the east, and four service buildings in the inner courtyard.

The monumental hospital is located in a parklike setting in a residential area near the Albright Knox Art Gallery and the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society. Today the wards are hidden by landscape features but earlier their gable ends created a rhythm which climaxed at the matching towers rising from the administration building. These towers with steep hipped roofs and round corner turrets help make the administration building the focal point of the grouping. This three and one half story building has a greater vertical emphasis and general massiveness than do the three and one half story domestically scaled wards. The low service buildings "are broader, simpler, and more characteristically Richardsonian than the central pavilion and the wards".¹

The material used to construct the walls of the central unit-rough faced random ashlar brown sandstone add to its massiveness. The first two wards on either side of the central core are also constructed of sandstone, while the other buildings are common brick of somewhat irregular texture. Originally these buildings were decorated with patterns created by tarred bricks, but the tar has been washed off.

While the hospital's plan owes a debt to Richardson's training at the Ecole des Beaux Arts, "the other sources of the design seem to have been mostly English particularly projects of Burges".² The buildings have machicolated cornices, windows with flat or segmental arches and dormers with quatrefoils in the tympanae. An interesting feature of the administration building is the entrance loggia with three round arches set between slightly projecting pavilions.

Richardson was a traditionalist with respect to structure and the hospital has masonry bearing walls with brick partitions. Interior features such as iron staircases and

and heavy hardwood trim are plain, reflecting the function of the buildings.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Buffalo State Hospital, and insane asylum built between 1872 and 1890, is an early institutional design by Henry Hobson Richardson (1838-1886), one of America's most important architects. This complex which was designed between 1870 and 1872 during a period when Richardson was developing his personal style is significant to understanding the evolution of Richardson's style towards simplification and effective disposition of masses. The grouping retains the picturesqueness desired by contemporaries in architecture of the 1870's but this is disciplined to create a unified composition. Frederick Law Olmsted (1822-1903), the leading American landscape architect of the late 19th century, planned the hospital's location and grounds and for this reason it is important to the history of landscape architecture.

Henry-Russell Hitchcock, believes that "the formation of Richardson's style took place when he designed the Brattle Square Church (in 1870) and the Buffalo State Hospital."¹ The hospital "opens the line of monumental designs for utilitarian structures along which Richardson was to advance furthest. The dark rough stone; the great scale; the simple detail largely of structural character and only generically derived from mediaeval precedent; the bold silhouette and the solid mass; the adjustment of the parts of the complex programme, not only in plan, but in an exterior composition that expresses that plan: these are, in the best sense of the word, Richardsonian"²

History:

In 1869 the city of Buffalo gave New York State the site for a mental hospital. Soon the committee of ten managers chose Richardson to design the buildings. Richardson was probably chosen because of the influence of William Dorsheimer, a Congressman who later became Lieutenant Governor. In 1868 Richardson had designed a house for Dorsheimer. A.J. Warner of Rochester was chosen supervising architect for the hospital and Olmsted was given responsibility for locating the complex on the site and for landscaping.

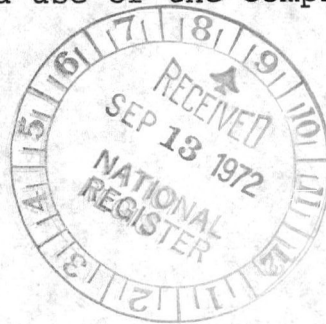

Number 8 continued:

The general plan of the complex which was adopted on August 25, 1870 by the managers was determined by Dr. Joseph P. Gray, head of the State Lunatic Asylum in Utica. The plan was probably influenced by the French inspired plan of the Connecticut State Hospital begun in 1867 by Sloan and Hutton.

In January 1871 Olmsted, Richardson, and Warner inspected the site and stone was ordered. Excavation began in June, 1872. Surviving drawings show that between 1870 and 1872 the design of the hospital buildings were changed to gain greater simplification. By September 18, 1872 the final design had been determined and the buildings in the Richardson grouping were built following this design except brick for economy was substituted for stone in the outer buildings.

By 1878 the east half of the complex was largely completed and in 1880 patients were received. The formal opening took place on November 13, 1881 although all the buildings were not completed until around 1890. At this time the remaining buildings still serve as part of the state mental hospital, although the continued use of the complex as it exists is very much in question.

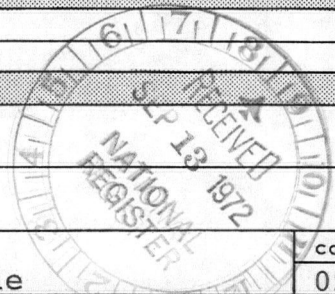

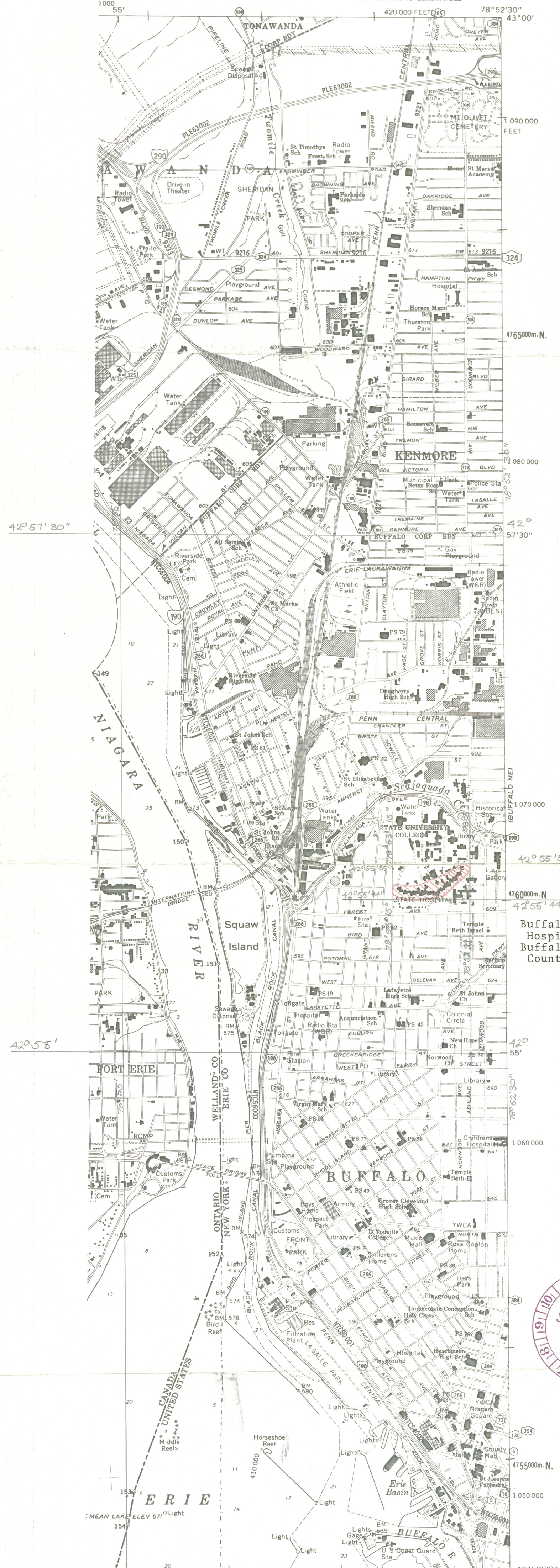
