ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE of area. (Describe physical setting, general character, and architecturally significant structures).

Ruggles Park, established in 1868, is a small square park of about 9 acres located in a densely settled working class neighborhood in the north-central section of the city. The principal design feature is the high granite retaining wall which separates the elevated land in the northeast corner of the park from the rest of the property. The only large flat open space is now a ballfield. Plantings are now relatively sparse.

Ruggles Park is an important focus for the surrounding neighborhood. Above the high granite retaining wall, a row of tenement houses looks over the park. The remaining architectural enframement is composed of a variety of 19th century house types, including stylish Second Empire and Italianate examples.

From the west, Ruggles Park marks a change in elevation from the Highlands to the edge of Flint Village, and a corresponding change in social and architectural character, with high-styled residences giving way to mill-workers' housing like that HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE of area. Ruggles is one of the two oldest parks in Fall River and is of historical interest because of the 1903 improvement plans drawn up by the nationally-known landscape architecture firm of Olmsted Brothers. The land for both Ruggles and South (now Kennedy) Parks was purchased by the city in 1868. During the last half of the 19th century the creation of public parks was seen as the proper response of civilized government to the phenomenon of urbanization, as recreation came to be understood as the natural antidote to the nervous exhaustion of an industrial age.

Ruggles Park, originally part of the old Rodman farm, provided a convenient recreational area for the city's working population. As described in <u>Fall River and Its Industries</u> (1877), the park was originally 15 acres and included a fine natural plantation previously known as Ruggles Grove. The area already had luxuriant trees and required little initial landscaping to make it charming.

In 1901 the city voted to establish a Park Commission, which engaged the well-known firm of Olmsted Brothers to make extensive improvements to South Park and to develop Ruggles, which by this date must have lost many of its earlier trees. At the turn of the century, Olmsted Brothers consisted of a sole partnership between John C. Olmsted and Frederick Law Olmsted, Jr. the two sons of the pioneering Frederick Law Olmsted, considered the founder of the profession of landscape architecture and one of the first city planners. The 1903 Olmsted Brothers plan and the extensive planting lists survive today in the files of the Parks Department.
